



# **Exercising your dog locally to** **Kelling Heath**

The closest and largest area where dogs can be let off leads is Holt Country Park (Edgefield Hill, Holt, NR25 6SP). This includes open areas, a series of woodland walks and cycle routes. Parking is varied on prices.

**However please be aware on the Heath there is livestock, cows and ponies and they request that dogs are kept on leads, this area is known as 'Holt Lowes' and is operated by Norfolk Wildlife Trust.**

**Inland walks:** Paths between Salthouse, Weybourne and Sheringham converge on heathland so this creates the opportunity of having many paths where even larger dogs can get exercise off their leads without worrying about any nearby roads. There is also woodland surrounding Sandringham, even though dogs are not allowed in Sandringham itself.

At Felbrigg Hall, dogs must be kept on leads and under close supervision in the parkland when the livestock is grazing – close control is advised in the woodland, but leads are not mandatory. Dogs are not permitted in the House or House gardens but are allowed in the tearoom and courtyard where water bowls are provided. There is a charge to park and you can walk around the estate free of charge, however if you want to go in the house or the walled garden there is a fee.

Sheringham Park also has large spaces for dogs to be off their leads. The only area where dogs are not permitted is the Bower as families and school groups use this area for a variety of fun and educational activities. Posts are provided outside to secure your dog to while you go in to see the wildflower meadow, sensory garden and wildlife pond. Drinking bowls and hitching posts are also provided around the visitor centre. Dogs are welcome in the Courtyard Café providing they are on lead.

The woods in Weybourne are another large area where dogs can exercise.

There are various walks along the coastal path and around Blakeney & Blakeney Point leading to Cley next the sea.

**Please be aware some parts of the coastal path are on private land and restrictions may apply.**





**A few other areas locally are:**

Holt Spout Hills

Pretty Corner / Sheringham Woods

Beeston Regis & West Runton Heaths – dogs welcome but need to be kept on leads when walking on the heathland between March and September.

Felbrigg woods

**Beaches:**

Dogs are welcome on many of North Norfolk's local beaches, however **between 1<sup>st</sup> May and 30<sup>th</sup> September many of the beaches operate a dogs on lead policy due to ground nesting birds.**
